CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Please read carefully as your signature on the entry form indicates your compliance with these conditions.

1. There is no limit to the number of exhibits that may be entered by any one person. In the unlikely event that entries exceed hall space, the committee reserves the right to reject entries through discussion with the entrant.
2. All items entered must be the property of the exhibitor.
3. Maximum number as specified in each category must be observed. GO WITHs do not qualify as an item in the category.
4. Categories with the word GENERAL means the entry must consist of the widest possible range of this category item.
5. Categories with the word PRIMARY means the item must have been originally sold with contents.
6. Collectable items that form a set will be counted as one item. ie. Cup, saucer, plate / dressing tray, set of candlesticks.
7. Exhibitors may supply their own lights and power will be arranged.
8. All items on display must be on table top unless prior approval is granted to place items on the floor.
9. All exhibitors must be a member of a Collectors Club, and the clubs details must be listed on the entry form.
10. All entries must remain intact until notice is given to commence dismantling and barriers have been removed on Sunday.
11. The Colonial Bottle and Collectors Club of W.A. Inc will take security precautions but accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage incurred to any exhibit.
12. Please make all displays free standing, as wall space is limited.
13. All displays must be neat from back view, so as not to detract from smaller entries that may be behind them.
14. Display tables have a weight capacity, please keep this in mind as they are plastic tables.
15. Cloths to the floor must be used on all tables, Swap and sell & displays.
16. If setting up SATURDAY morning, displays must be set up prior to swap and sell being set up.
17. Once the security barriers are in position, no person may handle any part of the displays without approval from and in the presence of a security officer or member of the Committee.
18. Only authorised personnel will be permitted behind the exhibition barriers.
19. Judging will start promptly at 8:30am on SUNDAY. The decision of the judges is final, subject to 17, and they reserve the right not to award prizes to entries considered substandard in display or for any other reason.
20. PROTEST any legitimate protest against a judging decision is to be lodged with the secretary of the Colonial Bottle & Collector Club within two hours of the completion of judging. This is to be in writing and lodged with a \$20 deposit. If the Protest is upheld, the deposit will be refunded; if the protest is rejected the deposit will be forfeited. The protest will be considered first by the Show Committee and if they consider the protest has some merit, it will then be considered by a panel of judges plus one adjudicator.
21. The Club welcomes non-competitive displays of any collectable item. Please provide details on the entry form including required space which is up to 2 metres and \$5 per metre after that.
22. The venue is NO SMOKING / NO VAPING and fully heated.
23. No exhibitor will be allowed in the hall from 8pm Saturday to 8.30am Sunday except officials.
24. The opening times and set up times are correct at the time of printing this schedule in FEB 2025. However these times may vary as required due to unknown circumstances in October 2025..

JUDGING: The system used is one where all entries in the same category and section are ranked in order of merit. Judges use five criteria of equal rank (except where stated otherwise). These are 1. Quality & rarity; 2. Interest & age; 3. Variety; 4. Condition (see note); 5. Display and information. NOTE: Condition – rarity will be considered when judging condition. Items need not necessarily be mint although this is desirable. If condition adds to the character as an old item, this should not detract from ranking. There will be five judges. In the event of a tied decision, an adjudicating judge will be called in to decide. All judgements will be recorded on sheets and available for perusal on completion of judging. Please read your schedule carefully as mistakes may lead to disqualification.

AWARDS: Best bottle of the Show – primary container only. Best Bottle Display; Best Display non-competitive; Best Display collectable; Novice display; Most innovative display and Most successful competitor determined by points (each 1st place gets 6 points; 2nd place = 5 points; 3rd place = 4pts) Award for the most informative display as presented to the public = all cash awards. There will also be prizes for the best Novice Display, Most Innovative Display and Display voted by the public as the best.
