EVENT HISTORY & OVERVIEW

The World Bass Fishing Championships (WBFC) has been running for 19 years, with the 2025 event heading to South Africa's Arabie Dam (Flag Boshielo Dam).

Australia first entered a team in 2019, consisting of six top tournament anglers. The team performed exceptionally, narrowly missing gold by just one point to host nation South Africa. With the Championships returning to South Africa in 2025, Team Australia is determined to go one better and claim gold.

2025 marks Australia's fourth entry into the WBFC, following a stellar finish at the 2024 event in Italy. Beaten only by Spain, Team Australia outranked favourites Italy, along with powerhouse teams from Germany and the USA, earning immense respect and growing recognition as a competitive tournament fishing nation.

In 2019 and 2022, Australia's participation was entirely self-funded by the anglers. Despite challenges, the team achieved remarkable results for a country without regular access to the target species. By 2024, with support from generous companies and individuals through an online raffle, the team successfully offset some costs.

2019 VAAL RIVER, SOUTH AFRICA

Where it started...

Every Aussie loves an underdog, and undoubtedly that's what we were heading into the World Bass Fishing Championships on the Vaal River, South Africa.

Australia doesn't have Largemouth Bass, our target species for the event. But all our anglers had experience chasing this species in Korea, Japan or the United States. What we did have though is confidence in our ability, and the skills fishing in such a diverse fishing country like Australia had provided us.

The tournament is held over three days, and after day one we were in third place, after day two we'd moved up one position to second. The last day was almost a fairytale finish. Perfect teamwork resulted in a full 15/15 limit for all three teams. Day two leaders South Africa, had 12/15. In an event like the World Bass Championships, consistency usually triumphs over all else.

Even after weighing in we didn't know if we'd done enough, some of the South African team was congratulating us. The other fourteen nations were stunned. Had South Africa just been beaten by first-timers on their home waters? It came down to the smallest measurable margin of one point between the two teams, with South Africa edging us out for the Gold Medal.





2024 LAKE BOLSENA, ITALY

Last years event...

The team arrived in Italy days before the tournament to pre-fish and familiarise themselves with the local area of Bolsena. They were warmly welcomed by the locals, who embraced teams from around the world. Grazie Mille! The team consisted of Mitchell Cone, Kris Hickson, Matthew Langford, Tommy Wood, Mick Johnson, and Braden Schuch.

Day 1 saw Australia finish in second place, with bag weights of 6.43 kg, 7.76 kg, and 8.56 kg, totaling 22.65 kg. They trailed behind Italy, with the USA in third.

Day 2 had Australia holding on to second place, with bag weights of 7.85 kg, 8.87 kg, and 9.16 kg, bringing their total to 48.53 kg. Cone and Langford were ranked 3rd overall in the individual team standings. Italy maintained the lead, and Spain climbed to third.

Day 3 was the final and most nerve-wracking day. As other countries weighed in, it became clear that Spain was likely to overtake them, and the team worried about being pushed to third. Their bag weights for the day were 8.16 kg, 8.33 kg, and 8.61 kg, resulting in a final total weight of 73.63 kg. When the final standings were announced, the team secured 2nd place overall.

In the individual rankings, Cone and Langford placed second with a total weight of 26.04 kg and a largest fish of 2.23 kg. Hickson and Wood finished in fourth place with a total weight of 25.25 kg, their largest fish being 2.14 kg.

Media coverage for the event was exceptional. The official Facebook page for the 2024 XVIII Bass Fishing World Championship provided regular updates and high-quality images. Team Australia also contributed, with wives on the trip keeping social media platforms updated daily. Reels shared by the team garnered over 38.5K views collectively, averaging over 4K views each. Even more is planned for the 2025 event to enhance engagement!

To promote sustainable fishing practices whilst providing educational opportunities to ensure the continuance of recreational fishing as a sport and a recreational pastime into the future.


PROFILE RAISING



2025 ARABIE DAM, SOUTH AFRICA



Arabie Dam History -

The history of Arabie Dam, also known as Flag Boshielo Dam follows.

Construction

The dam was built between 1985 and 1987 on the Olifants River in Limpopo, South Africa. It's a 36-meter high gravity dam with a reservoir capacity of 185 million cubic meters.

Naming

The dam was originally called Arabie Dam, but was renamed Flag Boshielo in 2001 after activist Flag Boshielo.

Purpose

The dam serves as a crucial resource for irrigation and water supply, supporting the region's agricultural and domestic needs. It's also a renowned fishing destination, home to over 40 fish species, including carp, barbel, tilapia, and largemouth black bass. Additionally, Nile crocodiles thrive in its waters.

Recreation and Tournaments

Arabie Dam is a hub for outdoor enthusiasts, offering camping facilities for visitors who wish to immerse themselves in nature. Its abundant fish population makes it a hotspot for anglers and an ideal venue for local and regional fishing tournaments. Competitions held at the dam often see impressive catches, with anglers testing their skills against species like largemouth black bass, a prized target in competitive fishing.
